DISTRICT BUSINESS

The District encourages residents to provide reports of any observed water waste. The District keeps an accounting of leak adjustments as a measure of non-revenue water lost to leaks. This data is compiled and report at the second Board Meeting of the month.

In April 2017, NCSD imported 69.7 AF of water over the 30 day period averaging 531 gallons per minute for a daily total of over 765,000 gallons per day. For the ten months, July through April, the District imported 708.4 AF of supplemental water. NCSD is 42 AF over the minimum scheduled take of 666 AF for this time period. For Fiscal Year 2017, NCSD is obligated to take or pay for a minimum of 800 AF from the City of Santa Maria ("CSM"). To import this amount of water, NCSD must average 66.7 AF per month from CSM. NCSD is meeting this target.

For April 2017, the community's water conservation effort reached 36.3% and for the year, the community reduced its consumption by 32.5% from 2013 consumption levels.

4) NCSD GW Reduction

The District's purveyor customers, GSWC and WMWC, each claim 16.66% (cumulatively 33.33%) of the imported water NCSD brings onto the basin through the NSWP. Of the 800 AF minimum imported water from the CSM, 266.6 AF will be credited to these two purveyor customers. The credited amount must be added to the District's groundwater pumping total every month to reflect the groundwater pumped by these customers in-lieu of taking imported water from the District.

The District reduced groundwater pumping by 51.6% for the month of April compared to the 5-year average from 2009 to 2013. Taking into consideration the above referenced purveyor customer credit the District can claim a cumulative groundwater pumping reduction for the first ten months of fiscal year 2017 of 53%. At the current Stage IV level of NMMA's Water Shortage Condition and Response Plan, the District must reduce its dependency on groundwater by 50% for the year, a goal the community has achieved.

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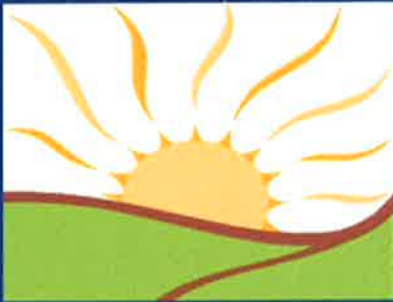

Nipomo CSD to Celebrate Completion of Nipomo Supplemental Water Project Reservoir

On Wednesday, May 24th, the Nipomo Community Services District's Board will host a Ribbon Cutting Ceremony to mark the completion of the District's Joshua Road Pump Station Reservoir. The Project completes another phase of the larger Nipomo Supplemental Water Project (NSWP) which connects the City of Santa Maria's water system with NCSD's.

The completed Joshua Road Pump Station Reservoir increases the District's capacity and will be able to hold 500,000 gallons of water imported from the City of Santa Maria. The Project finished on time and under budget at approximately \$3million.

Completion of the NSWP will fulfill NCSD's obligation to build pipes and pumps to bring import water onto the Nipomo Mesa. Once complete, the District will have the ability to bring the Court-ordered 2,500 acre feet per year ("AFY") of import water onto the Mesa.

General Manager, Mario Iglesias, commented "completion of the Reservoir is another accomplishment for the District and increases reliability of the Nipomo Supplemental Water Project allowing the District to bring more water onto the mesa."

The 11 am Ceremony will be at the pump station located at 805 Alta Vista Lane in Nipomo. Elected officials from SLO County and the City of Santa Maria are scheduled to attend.

People in one Nipomo neighborhood have been complaining for several years of rank odors coming from Willow in Nipomo, and now the town's water district may take action to get the stinky situation resolved.

"For a number of years now we've been smelling what I call raw sewage," said one neighbor who wished to remain anonymous.

Depending on which direction the wind is blowing, the occasional foul odor that drifts through The Oaks neighborhood can be overpowering for some residents.

"When it's happening, when it's going in full force, visitors that have pulled into our driveway before have been like, 'What's going on, what's that smell?'" he said.

Officials with the Nipomo Community Services District say that pungent odor is because of problems with the Willow Market's sewage discharge station. Complaints of the smell started back in 2014.

"What's happening is their sewage is turning septic, and when that pumps into our manholes, it creates a noxious gas that's drifting throughout the neighborhood and preventing people from having their 4th of July barbecues," said Mario Iglesias, Nipomo Community Services District General Manager.

Iglesias says while the owners of Willow Market have addressed some of the issues to mitigate the source of the problem, more needs to be done. Four warnings and three years later, the district is now considering whether to shut off the restaurant's water if the problem isn't resolved within 90 days.

"They've given us plans, we've seen plans, but they've yet to move on those plans. So we are waiting for them to make that construction a reality," Iglesias said.

While the district debates the next action to take, neighbors hope the stench will soon stop hovering over their homes with the goal for the neighborhood to soon breathe a sigh of relief.

KSBY reached out to Willow Market and Restaurant for an interview but the owners say they have no comment on the situation.

The Nipomo Community Services District will hold a public meeting on this during their next meeting on Wednesday at 9:00 a.m.

Nipomo CSD threatens to shut off water if Willow Market can't fix odor

Residents in the Blacklake community behind Willow Market complain a "noxious odor" sometimes invades the area, forcing them to stay inside their homes.

Willow Market in Nipomo is close to having its water shut off, after three years of odor complaints from neighbors and multiple district notices have failed to put an end to a smelly problem with the business' sewage system.

Nipomo Community Services District General Manager Mario Iglesias said that since 2014, the district has received about two dozen complaints from residents in the Blacklake community, which is located behind the popular restaurant and market, complaining about a "noxious odor" that sometimes invades the area, forcing residents to stay inside.

According to Iglesias, the odor stems from the business' private on-site sewer pump station that feeds into the district's sewer system. Large amounts of grease and other materials seem to accumulate in the station, become putrid and cause the smells, he said.

The district first notified Willow Market of the complaints in 2014, Iglesias said. Three years and three more notices later, the district still has seen little real change, and the odors remain, he said.

"They just don't seem to be coming up with the actions they need to deal with the odors," he said. "We're not quite sure why."

Willow Market owner Vernon "Sonny" Smith declined to comment on the issue Monday, saying just that the business was working with the district to address the concerns. He added he had no fear of the water being shut off.

In previous response to the notices, Smith and other Willow Market representatives said in letters to the district they were working to address the concerns.

According to the letters — included in a district staff report — the business contracted with a local plumbing company in 2015 to clear the grease build-up every 30 days and was looking into upgrading its lift station to eliminate the smells.

Iglesias said the latter has not yet occurred, and the odor complaints have continued, prompting the district to issue a final notice to the business, calling a public hearing to consider the issues on Wednesday.

Smith is being asked to provide a written plan for how he intends to address the smell, and then implement that plan within 60 days. If he does not, the district could choose to refuse to provide water to the business.

NIPOMO, Calif. - The Nipomo Community Services District has given the Willow Market a deadline of July 24th to fix their sewage problem.

Dozens of complaints have been filed to the district over the smell coming from the market's sewage system.

If the market does not comply, the services district will be meeting on this issue again on July 26th to reassess the situation. The Services District had previously threatened to turn off the shop's water.
