BACKGROUND

The Tefft Street Lift Station is the District's largest wastewater pump station. It was originally constructed in 1985 and was rebuilt in 2003. The nominal flow capacity of each pump (two total) is approximately 600 gallons per minute (gpm). The current pumps have been in place since 2003, are showing signs of extreme wear, have exceeded their useful life, and need to be replaced. Replacement of the existing pumps with pumps from the same manufacturer ensures that the replacement pumps will work without requiring the District to make any mechanical or other modifications to the lift station.

Staff obtained two quotes for two replacement pumps that have the same physical and flow characteristics as the existing pumps. Flo-Systems, Inc. submitted the lowest quote in the amount of \$40,615.

FISCAL IMPACT

The approved FY 14-15 Town Sewer budget includes funding for pump station rehabilitation in the amount of \$100,000.

STRATEGIC PLAN
