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District's July Pumping Decreases – Conservation Efforts Recognized

Nipomo CSD is thanking their customer's for the collective conservation effort. In July, the District pumped 245 acre feet or about 80 Million gallons of groundwater to meet customer demand. This is a nearly 16% improvement (reduction) compared to the District's five year average for July.

July and August are typically the District's largest production months due to irrigation demands of its customers. Many many water agencies are seeing increased demand for water due to drought conditions. A decrease in District pumping shows that customers are doing good work overall on conservation.

General Manager, Michael LeBrun, states "We want to thank all of our customers who have worked hard to reduce water demand in the midst of drought. If we all continue to work together, we can reach 30% reduction and prevent damage to our aquifer during this extended drought. Let's keep up the good work!"
