60th Anniversary - This January 2025 will mark a major milestone for our District—our 60th anniversary! Though providing clean water and processing wastewater doesn't seem too exciting, we understand that this is the cornerstone of a healthy and safe society. To celebrate our anniversary, we will be conducting some tours of our facilities. Be sure to sign up for email notifications to get up-to-date information on tour dates and times.

Blacklake Sewer System Consolidation: We are on track to “flip the switch” since the Lift Station is estimated to be completed July 2025. Upon completion, Blacklake customers will assume the town sewer rates. Look out for an upcoming "Flip the Switch" ceremony!

Other projects to look for in 2025:

- Supplemental Water Interconnection Improvements
- Water Distribution System Improvements – over 1-mile of water line upgrades on Pomeroy Road, Sea Pines Place, Red Oak Way
- Frontage Road Trunk Sewer Replacement – upgrade from 15” to 18” diameter gravity sewer main on Frontage Road between Juniper St and Division St.
- New 1-Million Gallon Water Storage Tank at Foothill Tank Site
- Updates to the District Strategic Plan
- Town Sewer Rate Study and Rates Prop 218 process
- Solid Waste Rates Prop 218 process
- On-going meter change out program to Advance Metering Infrastructure (AMI)

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District Achieves Over a Decade of Transparency Excellence

For the 11th consecutive year, the District received the District Transparency Certificate of Excellence by the Special District Leadership Foundation (SDLF) in recognition of its outstanding efforts to promote transparency and good governance. To receive the award, the District completed essential governance transparency requirements, including conducting ethics training for all board members, properly conducting public meetings, and reporting financial transactions and compensation.

Dana Reserve Project: Moving forward

The Dana Reserve Project has reached a significant milestone. The San Luis Obispo Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO) approved the annexation during its hearing on November 11, 2024. Following the necessary reconsideration period and the subsequent filing of the LAFCO Certificate of Completion, the Dana Reserve will be integrated into the District's service area.

SOLID WASTE VOUCHER PROGRAM

Nipomo Community Services District does not have a designated Cleanup Week. Currently, the District offers customers a call-in voucher program two times a year per address which allows for extra bags and a nominal fee for bulk items.

- Pay online by visiting www.ncsd.ca.gov (Note: ACI Payments, Inc. processes the payments on the District's behalf and charges a convenience fee per transaction.)
- Sign up for Auto Pay with the District (Only available for homeowners)
